



# MESSAGE FROM the Executive Principal



A number of years ago, schools in the Maltby Learning Community recognised the opportunities resulting from working together and sharing expertise and resources. All schools committed to working in partnership to support both student transition and transfer and further develop 'Teaching and Learning' across the Maltby Learning Community.

The success of this early collaboration convinced Governors at Maltby Academy and Redwood that a more formal partnership agreement would help further raise standards of achievement for all children and young people, and support the individual school's drive to secure 'outstanding' judgements at their next inspections. The Multi-Academy Trust, namely 'Maltby Learning Trust' was established.

#### What is a Multi - Academy Trust?

This arrangement is more about the Leadership and Governance of a school rather than anything else. It involves a number of Academies working together within an overarching Trust Board comprising members from each Governing Body. Each school continues to have its own Head Teacher and Governing Body within the framework of the Trust. In the Maltby Learning Trust there is a firm commitment for schools to keep their distinctive nature and individual identity whilst benefiting from a collective approach on certain aspects of the school work and organisation.

The full benefits are certainly too many to list, but the most obvious include the sharing of outstanding leadership whilst shaping good teaching and learning in partnership, opportunities to access specialist training across the schools and potential economies of scale when purchasing resources or appointing specialist staff.

We appreciate that this new arrangement may present some early difficulties but from my experience any sort of change often does. Having said that, this cannot be a reason for not trying to work more creatively albeit differently. I have been reassured by the way staff in the Trust have readily embraced the changes and opportunities presented. They have been keen to take on new ideas and initiatives for the benefit of the children and young people in their classrooms.



Over recent months I have had the privilege to work beyond the two Trust schools and engage with staff, students and parents at Maltby Manor and Maltby Lilly Hall Primary Schools. I have found this experience particularly rewarding born out of the level of enthusiasm and commitment shown by all the stakeholders in these schools. It is clear to me that there is a shared ambition for learners across the Learning Community, and staff, students and parents demonstrate a real pride in their schools and a desire to offer their children and young people the best possible learning opportunities. I have no doubt that Maltby Learning Community is on the cusp of something very exciting, but must ensure that the highest possible standard of leadership, teaching and learning, curriculum provision and student support is secured across all schools. At a time of uncertainty and great change on the educational landscape, the future for learning across the Maltby Learning Community is particularly exciting.

#### Moving into the Next Stage of Development...

Following the early success of the Maltby Learning Trust in MA and Redwood Academy, other primary schools in Maltby are considering working more formally with the group next academic year. Obviously, all schools in Maltby are at different points in their journey to achieving 'excellence' and will have determined their priorities accordingly. However, it is clear that all schools can benefit from a collaborative approach regardless of whether they are currently in an OFSTED category or striving to secure an 'outstanding' judgement at their next inspection. We look forward to shaping and sharing the broader vision for Maltby schools working within and beyond the 'Learning Trust' family.



# MESSAGE FROM, The Principal





It's been a term of change and growth at Redwood Academy. When we entered the Maltby Learning Trust with Maltby Academy last February, we knew that there was a possibility that we would be asked to work with another school. As it has transpired, that possibility became a reality sooner than we expected and I am now working across both Redwood Academy and Maltby Manor Primary School as Primary Executive Principal. Whilst at the moment I am spending quite a lot of time at Manor in order to support staff, students and parents. I can reassure you that I will remain in contact with Redwood Academy over the coming weeks and months and, of course, continue to be immensely proud of the young people and their achievements.

Next year Mr Pease will continue to take on the day to day running of the school but I will be working closely with him to make sure we keep pushing for the best possible education for our students. This new partnership has brought its challenges, but it has also brought huge opportunities. As time moves on we will be sharing resources which we could never have accessed as an individual school and also looking at bringing in additional specialist staff – something Redwood, as a small family school, could never have done. However, the biggest benefit is in enabling us to make an impact for a wider group of students.

We are now securing good outcomes for Redwood's youngsters because of the hard work our staff, students and parents have put in over the last few years. We can now share that expertise more widely and share the best practice with another school. That should give us huge confidence in the work we are still doing at Redwood and make us proud of everything we have achieved – however it must also make us think about how we can and must keep on pushing onward to 'Outstanding'.

Most people connected with Redwood Academy will know that Mr Horrigan, our Principal is currently providing senior leadership cover at Maltby Manor Junior and Infants School. I want to take this opportunity to explain to everyone why this is taking place.

Back in 2010, when Redwood was placed in 'special measures' following an inspection, the school received fantastic support from the Local Authority (LA). This involved help in forming a recovery plan and help with resources – some was financial to help with the buildings but there was also help in the form of LA staff who supported our teachers and teaching assistants to drive up the standards within school. This was maintained for the whole period that the school remained in special measures.

Since 2010, the country has faced cuts to funding in all areas of public services and this includes the LA. Whilst support to schools is still available, it is very different. The people who provided the practical support that our staff received are no longer employed, which has created a gap in the services provided.

Schools in Maltby have recognised that this 'gap' was being created and over a number of years have started to work together to ensure that, if a Maltby School ever required the support that Redwood benefitted from in 2010, we would be able to come together as a learning community and provide it. Maltby Manor School is currently in that position, following a recent inspection and their Head Teacher is not presently at work. Therefore, on a temporary basis, Mr Horrigan is operating as the Head at Maltby Manor.

Mr Pease is currently leading Redwood as the Acting Principal. He is receiving support from the senior leaders of the school and Mr Horrigan is in daily contact at Redwood. The governing body has considered the whole issue and has given support for this process. This isn't on the basis of believing that our staff can maintain standards, it is on the basis that we know that they can continue to develop the school and raise standards.

I hope that this explanation of current events goes some way to reassuring everyone that we are taking a planned and considered approach to everything that we do, which has the safety and progress of the children as our main focus.
