Curriculum outline

Reading: We will be learning and consolidating sounds through RWI. We will begin to answer simple comprehension questions based on 'The day the crayons quit'.

Writing: We will be writing a narrative based on the story 'The way back home'. We will also write a short narrative based on the story 'How to catch a star'. We will be developing our skills of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops as well as using a range of vocabulary.

Maths: We will focus on place value within 20 and addition and subtraction within 20.


Science: We will be learning all about animals including humans. We will focus on types of animals and activities around grouping. We will also identify and name basic parts of the human body.


